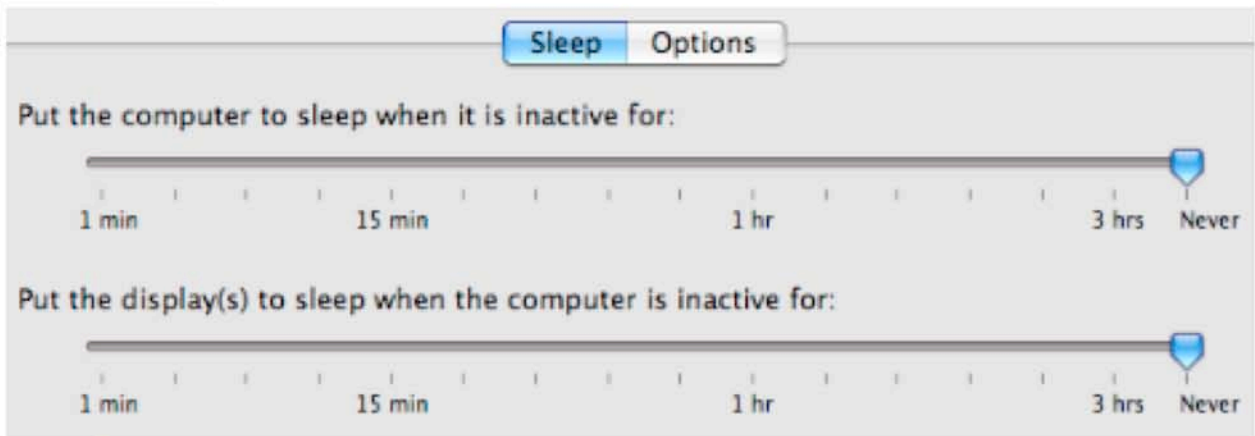


# How to burn a CD

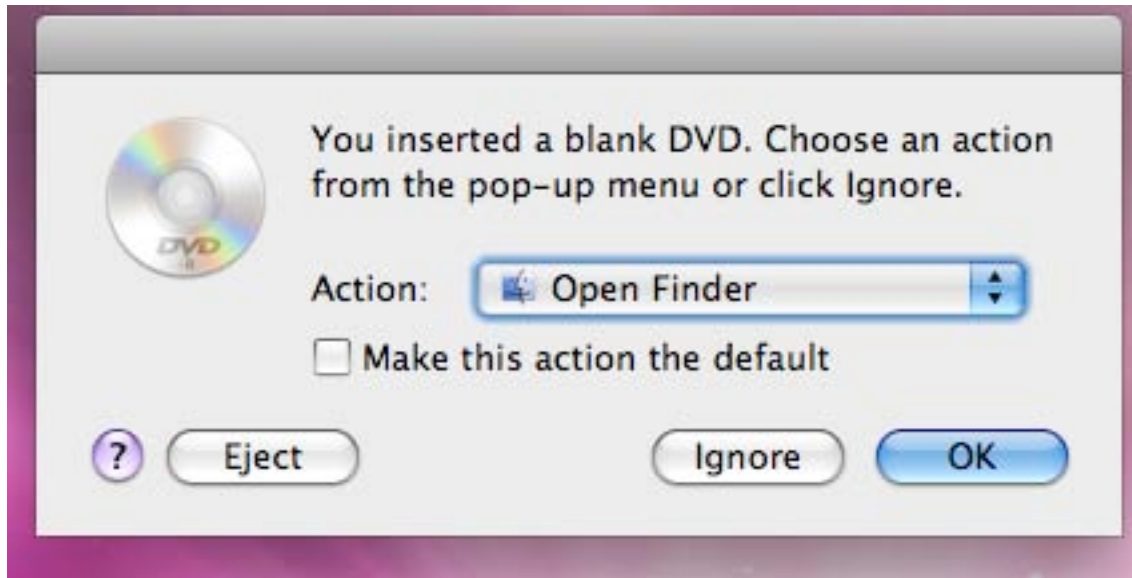
When you copy files onto a CD it is called burning a CD. .

Tip: Before you burn a CD make sure your Mac does not go to sleep. Go to your Systems Preference set the slide in Energy to Never.

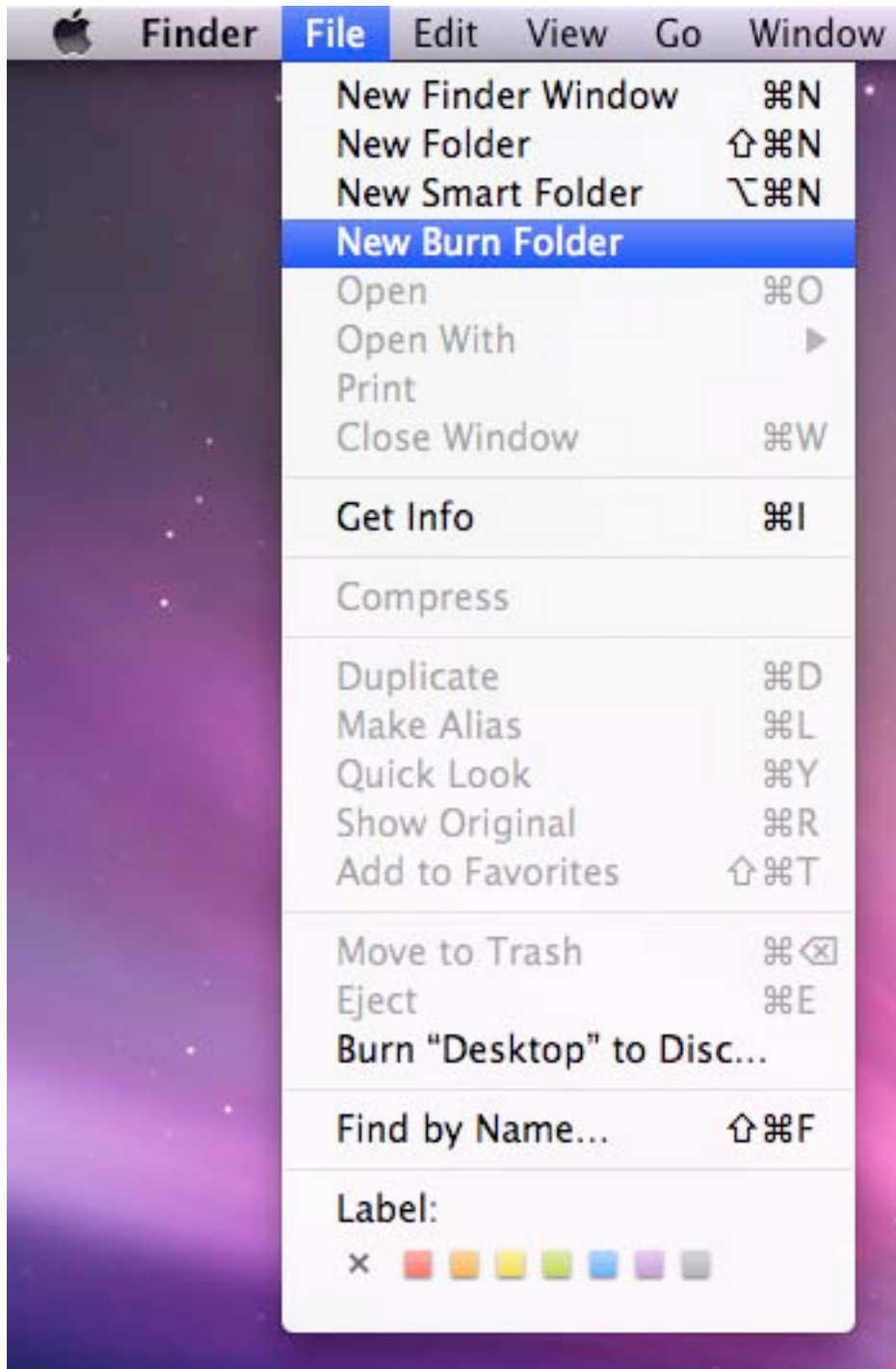


1. Insert a blank CD

2. From the “Action” pop-up menu, select what you want to happen: choose “OpenFinder” for the most common burn procedure, which is copying data files from your computer to the CD.



4. Go to the Menu Bar and choose File and go down to New Burn Folder



When you do that it will look like this.

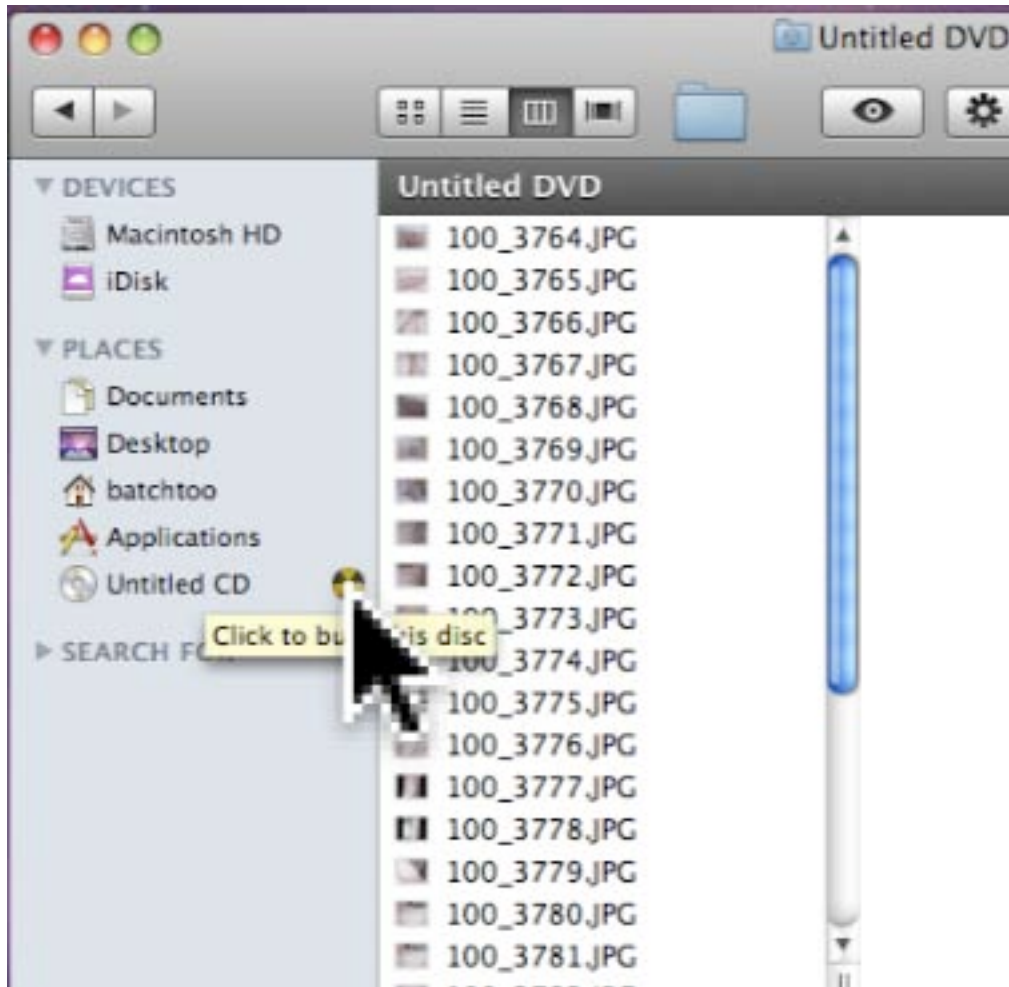


Next open up a folder you want to burn. I am going to use iPhoto to Demo this. So I am opening iPhoto and I will select all the photos I want to put on this Disc.

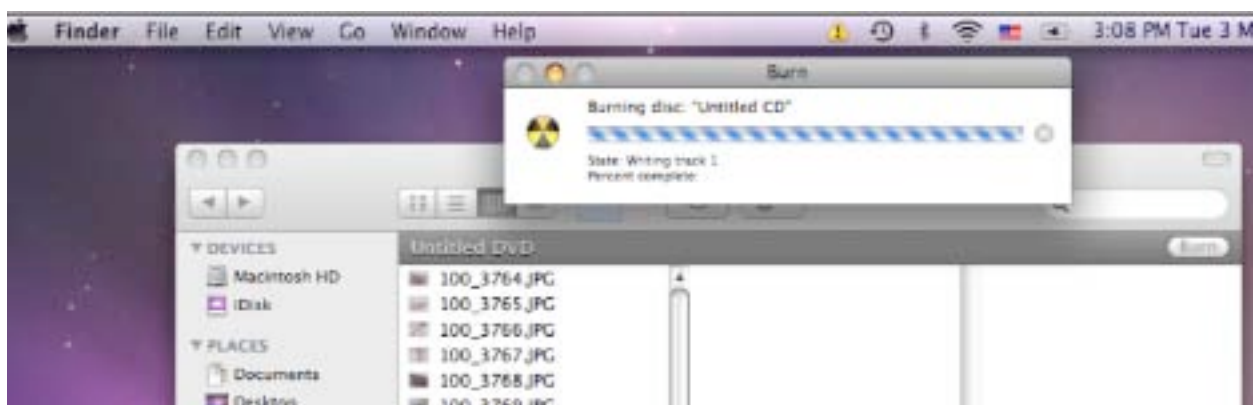
Then you will select the photos or files you want to burn and drag and drop them on the CD..

5. Open up your CD (my photo shows DVD, that was a mistake it should of been a CD photo)

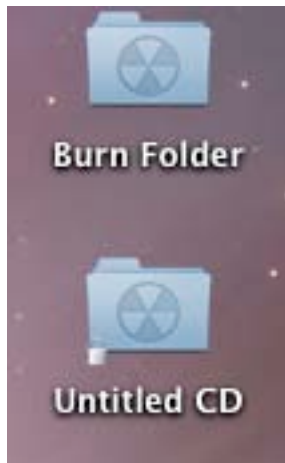
Then go over to the yellow and black burn icon and click it on.



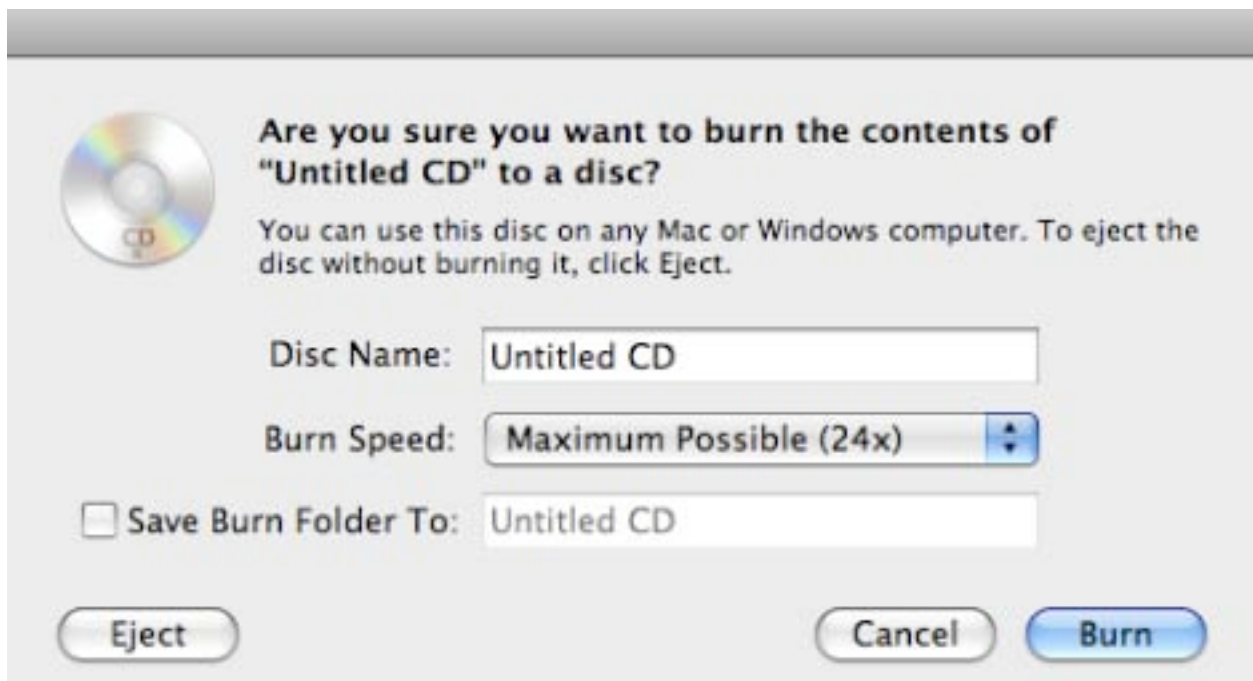
This is what it will look like when you are burning a disk.



Your CD will turn into a Folder while burning.



When it is done it will let you name your CD.



When the burning is all over it will ding at you to let you know it is finished.

You now have a useable CD.
